How to Get to Boracay

Manila is the country's main gateway for international flights with Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA).

There are two (2) ways to access Boracay Island from Manila (MNL).

1 CATICLAN AIRPORT (MPH)

This is the nearest airport to the island. The carriers servicing this airport are Philippine Airlines, Cebu Pacific Air, Air Asia and Skyjet.

2 KALIBO AIRPORT (KLO)

Travellers from Kalibo Airport require a leisurely 1.5-hour transfer by land to reach Caticlan, the jump-off point to access Boracay Island.
